

**6th FINA WORLD OWS CHAMPIONSHIPS 2010
15 – 23 JULY 2010 ROBerval CANADA**

Selection Policy

For any selection to be confirmed, all swimmers and team staff wishing to be considered for selection must have completed and returned a Selection Acceptance Form, as outlined in 3.14

The team for the FINA World OWS Championships 2010 will be identified from performances at the British Gas Long Course (50m) Championships 29 March–3 April 2010 (the ‘Pool Trials’), the FINA World OWS Championships Ostia, Italy 19-22 July 2009, and from the LEN Cup, Eilat, Israel, 9 May 2010 (the ‘Open Water Trials’).

1. ATHLETE SELECTION

- 1.1. There are 2 male and 2 female places available for selection in the 10km event and 5km event at the FINA World OWS Championships 2010.
- 1.2. There are 4 male and 4 female places available for selection for the ‘Open Water Trials’ that will act as the 2nd stage selection meet for the FINA World OWS Championships 2010.
- 1.3. The first placed British swimmer at the Ostia FINA World Championships 2009 will gain automatic selection for the ‘Open Water Trials’.
- 1.4. Remaining places in the men’s 10km ‘Open Water Trials’ will be filled by the fastest ‘available’ male swimmers at the ‘Pool Trials’ achieving the 1500m Freestyle qualifying standard in Table 1 below.
- 1.5. Remaining places in the women’s 10km ‘Open Water Trials’ will be filled by the fastest ‘available’ female swimmers at the ‘Pool Trials’ achieving the 800m Freestyle qualifying standard in Table 1.
- 1.6. Times achieved at the ‘Pool Trials’ in the Finals will take precedence over Heat performances.
- 1.7. The 2 fastest ‘available’ male swimmers and the 2 fastest ‘available’ female swimmers in the 10km ‘Open Water Trials’ will be selected for the FINA World OWS Championships 2010.
- 1.8. Places in the 5km event at the FINA World OWS Championships 2010 will be offered to ‘available’ swimmers who have qualified for the 10km event in 1.7 above.
- 1.9. Where 10km qualifiers decline the 5km event in 1.8 above, remaining places in the 5km event will be filled by the next fastest ‘available’ swimmer(s) at the ‘Open Water Trials’. If places still remain, these will be filled by the next fastest ‘available’ swimmer(s) in the 800m Freestyle (female) and the 1500m Freestyle (male) events at the ‘Pool Trials’.

2. COACH SELECTION

- 2.1 The OW Performance Manager will act as the Team Leader for the World OWS Championships 2010.
- 2.2 The Head Coach and support coaches will be selected at the discretion of the OW Performance Manager in consultation with the National Performance Director.
- 2.3 Coaches 'available' for selection must be holders of the UKCC/ASA Coaches Certificate or equivalent, or be enrolled on an UKCC/ASA Coach Course at time of selection.
- 2.4 Coaches 'available' for selection must have been resident within the UK for a minimum period of two years leading into the 'Open Water Trials', unless employed or deployed by a British or Home Country National Governing Body.

3. GENERAL CONDITIONS

- 3.1 The reference to 'available' in the sections above denotes British swimmers and coaches who have declared their availability (as outlined in 3.14) to attend the FINA World OWS Championships 2010.
- 3.2 Only swimmers eligible and available to represent Great Britain at the FINA World OWS Championships 2010 will be selected.
- 3.3 Split times or performances from time trials will not be considered.
- 3.4 Only times recorded at the 'Pool Trials' will be considered for selection for the 'Open Water Trials'.
- 3.5 If an equal placing occurs at the 'Pool Trials' in the Finals, then the swimmer with the fastest time in the Heats will be selected. If said swimmers have recorded an equal time in the Heats then a swim-off will be conducted to confirm selection at a time and venue to be determined by the OW Performance Manager in consultation with the National Performance Director.
- 3.6 Swimmers must demonstrate an uncompromised commitment to training preparation for peak performance at the FINA World OWS Championships 2010 as determined by their personal coach and approved by OW Performance Manager. If for any reason a swimmer is unable or unwilling to fulfill this commitment, they may be withdrawn from the team.
- 3.7 **ALL** team members will be expected to attend ALL activities organised between the end of the 'Pool Trials' and the FINA World OWS Championships 2010, if selected and required to attend by OW Performance Manager. Under exceptional circumstances, written approval to be excluded from activities may be given by the National Performance Director. Failure to attend compulsory activities could result in withdrawal from the team.
- 3.8 Team members will be expected to attend each programmed camp, where selected, on a full-time basis, taking part in all programmed activities. No team member will be allowed to leave a camp or undertake any activities that are not directly relevant to the camp programme, this includes any external media or social activities.
- 3.9 Selected swimmers may not take holiday or attend overseas camps and/or competitions between the 'Pool Trials' and the FINA World OWS Championships 2010 without prior written approval from the OW Performance Manager and the National Performance Director.
- 3.10 Swimmers becoming unfit due to illness or injury at any time between the 'Pool Trials' and the FINA World OWS Championships 2010 must notify British Swimming immediately and will be required to undertake a full medical examination which may result in the swimmer being de-selected from the team at the discretion of the OW Performance Manager and National Performance Director.
- 3.11 Swimmers may be subjected to fitness (land/water) and/or medical tests at any time between the 'Pool Trials' and the conclusion of the FINA World OWS Championships 2010. Any swimmer judged to be unfit by British Swimming, following tests conducted by British Swimming, may be de-selected from the team at the discretion of the OW Performance Manager and National Performance Director.

- 3.12 Replacement of swimmers withdrawn from the FINA World OWS Championships 2010 team will be considered by the National Performance Director and OW Performance Manager if viewed to be in the best interest of the overall team performance. Replacement swimmers will be identified at the complete discretion of the OW Performance manager and the National Performance Director.
- 3.13 All selected team members will be required to sign and comply with the British Swimming Code of Conduct
- 3.14 **Selection Acceptance Form:** All swimmers and coaches will be expected to complete a Selection Acceptance Form to confirm they will be available to participate in the World OWS Championships 2010. Failure to do so will be interpreted as non-availability by the Federation. Selection Acceptance Forms will be provided by British Swimming to qualifying team members at the 'Pool Trials'.
- 3.15 British Swimming will impose a fine of £500 on any swimmer who withdraws from the team for any reason other than illness or injury (as certified by an independent medical advisor approved by British Swimming Medical Staff).
- 3.16 All team members will be expected to abide by the Media Protocols of the British Swimming Programme. Athletes must only speak to the media about their own performances and group coaches must only comment on performances of swimmers in their group. The OW Performance Manager and National Performance Director may discuss performances of the entire team.
- 3.17 The National Performance Director and OW Performance Manager will exercise their authority to ensure that the final selections for the FINA World OWS Championships 2010 are in line with this policy and will result in the best possible achievements at the FINA World OWS Championships 2010.
- 3.18 Any appeals against nominations in relation to this GB Technical Swimming Committee selection policy must be made in accordance with the British Swimming appeals procedures.
